EVALUATION REPORT & RECOMMENDATION FOR THE

CONVERSION OF DONGHOL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TO DONGHOL INTEGRATED SCHOOL, BARANGAY DONGHOL,

ORMOC CITY, DIVISION OF ORMOC CITY.

BACKGROUND

In consonance with Article XIV section 1 of the 1987 Philippine Constitution which states that "The state shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all, the Department of Education shall establish, maintain, and support a complete, adequate, and integrated system of education relevant to the needs of the people and society.

Republic Act 9155 for this purpose ensures that schools and learning centers receive the kind of focused attention they deserve and the kind of educational programs, projects and services they need taking into account the interest of all the members of the community;

In view thereof, the people of Barangay Donghol and the binding local government units of the city desires to create and establish an integrated school in order to cater the inconveniences in their educational journey. Likewise, it provides the means by which the standards may be achieved and sustained; and ensure the effective and accessible delivery of quality basic education

Donghol Elementary School has been established since January 1929 which started as a complete elementary school. Over the years, it has produced professionals and skilled workers contributing to the development of the society and the country as well. In line with the vision of the department to continuously improve itself to better serve its stakeholders, DepEd Ormoc City division aims to establish a junior high school to be integrated in Donghol Elementary School. It envisions education to be accessible to students especially those from far –flanged areas and out of school children thus providing them opportunities to be in school and supporting parents lessen their expenses daily. Likewise, it caters to the graduates of the feeder school to be accommodated in this proposed integrated school. Hence the conversion of Donghol Integrated School.



FINDINGS:

- 1. Donghol Elementary School has a lot area of 20,057 sq. m. still owned by the city government of Ormoc enclosed with a perimeter fence. It has 11 classrooms for instructions where 2 of which are condemnable currently used by a Junior High School extension class, one (1) e- classroom, a temporary canteen, a clinic in a library, principal's office, and eleven (11) functional comfort rooms. It has an available buildable space enough for construction of additional classrooms.
- 2. Donghol Elementary School has twelve (12) teachers with a total enrolment of 399 K to 6 pupils managed by a principal.
- 3. The Local School Board of Ormoc City thru the local chief executive, Hon. Richard I. Gomez duly supported by the SP committee on Education Hon. Nolito M. Quilang favorably endorsed an approved Resolution No. 2018-312 dated Dec. 4, 2018 supporting the barangay Resolution No. 8 s. 2018 expressing the city's full support in the establishment of integrated school in the barangay for its purpose.
- 4. The city government of Ormoc approved a certification expressing their full support for the operation and maintenance of Donghol IS while the school is not yet included in the national budget.

RECOMMENDATIONS

In view of the foregoing evaluation and findings, the team respectfully recommends that:

- 1. The established Integrated school shall be named **Donghol Integrated School** and is authorized to operate effective School Year 2020- 2021.
- 2. The Schools Division Superintendent shall provide a school head that can manage the school based on qualification standards to manage an integrated school.
- 3. The School shall be considered in the budget preparation for its eventual inclusion in the immediate succeeding General Appropriation Act (GAA).
- 4. The Schools Division Superintendent shall provide teachers trained on the K to 12 Curriculum and consider additional regular teachers to this school to complete the number of teachers required to operate the integrated school.
- 5. The Schools Division Superintendent likewise shall provide school buildings, chairs, textbooks, and other resources to the school.

6. DepEd Division of Ormoc shall facilitate the transfer of School Site to DepEd from the City government of Ormoc.
