STATUS OF VACCINATION IN DEPED AND RECENT UPDATES

- Attached is an Aide Memoir from Usec. Alain Del B. Pascua, Undersecretary for 1. Administration, reporting the Status of and some Recent Updates on Vaccination in the Department of Education as of October 2021.
- It is underscored in Paragraph 6 under C. Updates and Ways Forward which 2. emphasizes that, under IATF Resolution No. 148-B, s. 2021, which will take effect on December 1, 2021, in areas where there are sufficient supplies of COVID-19 vaccines as determined by the NVOC, all establishments and employers in the public and private sector shall require their eligible employees who are tasked to do on-site work to be vaccinated against COVID-19. Employees who remain to be unvaccinated shall be required to undergo regular RT-PCR tests, or antigen tests, if the RT-PCR test is insufficient, at their own expense for purposes of on-site work.
- Relative thereto, all unvaccinated DepEd Region VIII employees are encouraged to undergo vaccination during the scheduled National Vaccination Day from November 29 to December 1, 2021, in the nearest vaccination facility and a vaccine of their choice.

4. Immediate dissemination of and compliance with this Memorandum are desired.




STATUS OF VACCINATION IN DEPED (OCTOBER 2021) AND MOST RECENT UPDATES

The DepEd Task Force COVID-19 (DTFC), through its vaccination program representatives, provides the following updates on the status of vaccination in the Department.

A. Vaccination Data Submitted by Regional Focals¹

1. Vaccination Status of Personnel

- The data, covering 932,396 personnel from field offices and schools, are based on the submissions of Regional COVID-19 Response/Vaccination Focals to the Bureau of Learner Support Services-School Health Division (BLSS-SHD) as of 19 October 2021.²
- As reported, majority (67.33%) of the eligible population or 627,778 field personnel are vaccinated either with the 1st dose or complete up to the 2nd dose.



• 318,205 or 34.14% of the total number of personnel or an average of about 7 personnel per school³ have not been vaccinated, although more than two thirds of this number said they have already registered in their respective LGUs and were waiting for the schedule of their vaccination, at the time of reporting.

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
¹ The Bureau of Human Resource and Organizational Development-Employee Welfare Division (BHROD-EWD) is still updating its data on the vaccination of Central Office personnel. The latest data available from the August 2021 Aide Memoire on the Status of Vaccination in DepEd show that 85% of the eligible population (1,535 of 1,808) have already been vaccinated with either at least the first dose or up to the second dose. Only 273 (15%) have not been vaccinated, but almost half of them have at least already registered for their vaccination.



- Attached is the regional breakdown of submitted data (Annex A) for ready reference. Discrepancies in the percentage totals (more or less than 100%) have been noted in most regions and have affected the percentage total for the national summary. These are being validated and will be corrected in the vaccination status report for November.
- Taking the data as is, the percentage of vaccinated personnel has increased by more than 200% from only 20% in July to almost 70% in October.





Among those who said they did not register for vaccination, the number of
personnel were waiting for their preferred brand is higher than those who
lacked trust in the COVID-19 vaccine.

DepEd Offices and Schools Used as Vaccination Sites

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
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3. School Personnel Who Have Volunteered as Vaccination Team Members

C. Updates and Ways Forward

1. On 01 October 2021, BLSS-SHD met with the regional focals to discuss issues, concerns, and ways forward in the regular reporting of vaccination data.

Discussing the provisions of DTFC Memorandum No. 513 (Regular Reporting of Vaccination Data by Regional Focals) co-signed by the DTFC and the Office of the Undersecretary for Field Operations (OUFO), the reporting template was further enhanced to ensure that the data requirements of regions are also reflected in the template. The template which emanated from the said meeting has been used by the regional focals for their data reporting for October.

⁶ The Office of the Undersecretary for Administration (OUA) through the Information and Communications Technology Service (ICTS), issued OUA Memorandum No. 00-721-0093 (Mass Dissemination on Self-Reporting for COVID-19 Vaccination Tracker) to officially disseminate the vaccination tracker, accessible through the DepEd Mobile App, and enjoin personnel nationwide to use the tracker in reporting their vaccination status.

The changes to the template will be made official through a separate issuance, which is also likely to provide guidance on the inclusion of data on the vaccination of learners, where already applicable.

2. In support of Memorandum No. DM-OURO-21-0327 issued by the OUFO in September, which requested the field for the breakdown of vaccination data, particularly from the 638 schools participating in the pilot implementation of face-to-face classes, the DTFC and OUFO co-issued **DTFC Memorandum** No. 533 (Master Listing for COVID-19 Vaccination of School Personnel who will Pilot Face-to-Face Classes) which provided the template for the master listing of participating personnel, as vetted by the National COVID-19 Vaccination Operations Center (NVOC).

The said Memorandum was drafted in close coordination with the national Composite Team leading the preparations for the pilot implementation.

The DTFC issued **DTFC Memorandum No. 539** (Endorsement of the Initial Set of Master Lists Received by the DTFC from Regional Focals for the Pilot Implementation of Face-to-Face Classes) (**Annex B**) which officially endorsed the master lists received by BLSS-SHD to the Composite Team.

Enumerating the reasons cited by the personnel as to why they were not willing to be vaccinated, the DTFC through the said Memorandum has enjoined the school heads and school health personnel concerned to provide necessary explanation to teachers and address any possible hesitation to be vaccinated.

Attached is the latest summary of the vaccination status of personnel in the pilot schools (Annex C).

3. As a result of the DTFC's ongoing coordination with the NVOC, the Department of Health (DOH) issued a memorandum to its regional offices (Centers for Health Development) requesting the inoculation of unvaccinated personnel in schools participating in the pilot implementation of face-to-face classes (Annex D).

The DTFC takes note of the ongoing coordination by the Composite Team with the DOH and DILG to further strengthen vaccination in all schools, and will support as needed.

The DTFC strongly recommends the alignment of such coordination with the previous efforts of NVOC, in coordination with the DTFC, as regularly reported in the previous aide memoires.

4. The DTFC also reports that Moderna vaccines have been donated by the Office of Deputy Speaker Loren Legarda to DepEd, through the Office of the Undersecretary for Finance (OUA), for possible inoculation to DepEd personnel and family members based in NCR. The turnover ceremonies were

held last 12 November 2021 at the Central Office. The matter has been coordinated with concerned offices including the BHROD, and the Regional Office of DepEd NCR.

- 5. DepEd is expected to continue to actively support the government's COVID-19 vaccination program, especially through participation in the following:
 - a. **Pediatric vaccination** (vaccination of 12-17-year-olds) field offices have already been participating in this initiative, maximizing existing arrangements with their respective LGUs, as guided by issuances on vaccination; at the national level, the DOH has reached out to DepEd through the Public Affairs Service (PAS) in intensifying demand generation activities
 - b. Upcoming **National Vaccination Days** set on 30 November-1 December 2021 DepEd is part of the operations and the demand generation committees represented by BLSS/BLSS-SHD and PAS, respectively; for operations, DepEd is expected to support in allowing the use of schools as vaccination sites, and in enjoining health personnel in volunteering as members of vaccination teams

The details of DepEd's participation in the said activities will be discussed in separate DTFC issuances. Existing policies as issued will be reiterated or strengthened as needed to ensure DepEd's active participation in the said activities.

6. On 11 November 2021, the IATF issued Resolution No. 148-B, s. 2021, which provides that "in areas where there are sufficient supplies of COVID-19 vaccines as determined by the NVOC, all establishments and employers in the public and private sector shall require their eligible employees who are tasked to do on-site work to be vaccinated against COVID-19. Eligible employees who remain to be unvaccinated may not be terminated solely by reason thereof. However, they shall be required to undergo RT-PCR tests regularly at their own expense for purposes of on-site work. Provided that, antigen tests may be resorted to when RT-PCR capacity is insufficient or not immediately available."

The said resolution shall take effect on 01 December 2021 after publication in a newspaper of general circulation and/or the Official Gazette. A separate DTFC memorandum will be issued on this matter.
