The Department of Education through the Bureau of Learners Support Services – School Health Division (BLSS-SHD) continues the implementation of the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) nationwide in accordance with the General Appropriations Act (GAA) FY 2022 and in compliance with the RA 11037 also known as the “Masustansyang Pagkain Para sa Batang Pilipino Act signed during the administration of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte last June 20, 2019, constitutes the primary statutory basis for the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP). It aims to implement programs that sustain and improve the health of school children through the SBFP.

In addition, Executive Order No. 138, s. 2021 titled “Full Devolution of Certain Functions of the Executive Branch to Local Governments, Creation of a Committee on Devolution, and for Other Purposes” was issued to support the efficient implementation of the Supreme Court Ruling on the Mandanas-Garcia ruling case and strengthen the autonomy and empowerment of local government units (LGUs). Based on the said Executive Order, it shall direct the full devolution of certain functions of the Executive Branch to the LGUs and provides for the creation of a Committee on Devolution to monitor and strengthen the implementation mentioned EO. In DepEd, the SBFP was identified by the ExeCom for the Devolution Transition Plan and the proposal is to seek support from the LGUs on the establishment of Central Kitchens.

In line with this, BLSS-SHD shall conduct a Benchmarking Conference on the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) Central Kitchens on December 5-7, 2022 in Region XI.

The activity aims to benchmark the existing central kitchens in Davao de Oro and conduct a dialogue with the Local Government Units (LGUs) and harness their commitment to support SBFP. The activity intends to show how SBFP is operationalized through central kitchens and hopefully convince the LGUs on the social impact of SBFP and central kitchens on the lives of the learners and the community they live with.

It is respectfully requested that the participants be advised on the following:

1. Participants to the Benchmarking Conference are the Regional SBFP Focal Persons, select SDO-SBFP Focal Person and their counterpart LGU Representative (one per region). Traveling expenses of DepEd participants shall be charged against downloaded funds while traveling expenses of LGU representatives are requested to be charged against their local funds. Representatives will be coming from the SDO that are interested in establishing Central Kitchen/s within the region.
2. May we also request the select SDO Focal Persons to invite and coordinate with their counterpart LGU regarding the said activity.
3. Registration of participants shall start at 1:30pm on the date of arrival, lunch will be served. All participants are expected to arrive in time for the Opening Program.
4. They are advised to be ready with their vaccination and/or booster cards. They are also requested to wear face masks for the duration of the activity, bring their own sanitizers, and observe minimum health protocols against COVID-19 at all times. However, participants are discouraged from attending the activity if exposed to a COVID-positive or if symptoms of COVID-19 are already being experienced.

BULLETIN OF INFORMATION

I. RATIONALE:

The Department of Education through the Bureau of Learners Support Services – School Health Division (BLSS-SHD) continues to implement the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) nationwide in accordance with the General Appropriations Act (GAA) for FY 2022 and in compliance with Republic Act No. 11037 *“Masustansyang Pagkain para sa Batang Pilipino Act”*.

RA 11037 or the *“Masustansyang Pagkain Para sa Batang Pilipino Act”*, signed by President Duterte on June 20, 2018, constitutes the primary statutory basis for the SBFP. The law aims to implement programs that sustain and improve the health of school children thru the SBFP.

In recent events, Executive Order No. 138, s. 2021 titled *“Full Devolution of Certain Functions of the Executive Branch to Local Governments, Creation of a Committee on Devolution, and for Other Purposes”* was issued to support the efficient implementation of the Supreme Court Ruling on the Mandanas-Garcia case and strengthen the autonomy and empowerment of local government units (LGUs). It directs the full devolution of certain functions of the Executive Branch to the LGUs and provides for the creation of a Committee on Devolution to monitor the implementation of said EO. Also, for FY 2022, the funding allocation was significantly reduced from 6 Billion Pesos to 3.3 Billion Pesos.

The proposed activity to benchmark the existing central kitchens in Davao de Oro shall be part of the plan to conduct a dialogue with Local Government Units (LGUs) and harness their commitment to support SBFP. The activity is aimed to show how SBFP is operationalized through central kitchens and hopefully convince the LGUs on the social impact of SBFP and central kitchens on the lives of the learners and the community as well.

II. OBJECTIVES:

The activity aims to:

1. showcase the various central kitchens operations in Davao de Oro; and
2. discuss with select LGUs and focal persons on how to establish and operationalize central kitchens
