MECHANICS FOR POSTER-MAKING CONTEST

I. Participants

The Regional Climate Change Caravan Poster-Making Contest aims to raise awareness about climate change and its impact on our planet. The creative posters will serve as powerful tools to inspire and educate others about the urgency of addressing this global issue.

The Division Offices are given the discretion to select (1) participant for the Poster-Making Contest to represent their Division.

The theme of the poster-making contest is "Regional Climate Change Caravan 2023: Journey Towards a Sustainable Future." The posters should reflect the concept of a collective effort to combat climate change and promote sustainable practices.

II. Dates

The contest will be conducted on day two of the caravan, July 27, 2023, from 1:00-2:00 in the afternoon at RELC NEAP - Training Hall. Adjudication of entries and the announcement of winners will be held on the same day.

III. Poster-Making Contest Guidelines

- Maximize the limited funds allotted for this activity the coach of all participants is the Division DRRM Coordinator. Participants may submit only one entry per person.
- 2. For the poster specifications:
 - a. **Size:** posters should be created on 20"x30" illustration board which will serve as their canvas which will be provided by the organizer.
 - b. **Orientation:** Only portrait orientation is acceptable.
 - c. **Medium:** The participants should bring and provide their own may drawing and coloring materials such as crayons, oil pastels, coloring pencils, watercolor, poster paints, markers, or any medium for creating their posters.
- 3. Content Guidelines:
 - a. The poster should creatively express the theme "Regional Climate Change Caravan 2023: Journey Towards a Sustainable Future."
 - b. Focus on highlighting the impacts of climate change and the importance of sustainable practices, such as renewable energy, reducing carbon emissions, preserving biodiversity, and adopting eco-friendly lifestyles.
 - c. Use imagery, symbols, and colors that convey a sense of urgency, hope and the need for action.
 - d. Avoid any content that may be offensive, discriminatory, or inappropriate.
- 4. After the announcement of the central theme of the contest, the participants are given five minutes to consult with the coaches. After that, the participants are given two hours to work on their entries. No more coach interference is allowed during this period.
- 5. Judging Criteria:
 - a. **Creativity and Originality**: The uniqueness and innovative approach in conveying the message.

- b. Visual Impact: The overall visual appeal, use of color, composition, and clarity.
- c. Relevance to the Theme: How well the poster aligns with the contest theme and conveys the urgency of addressing climate change.
- d. Message Clarity: The effectiveness of the poster in communicating the intended message.
- e. Overall Execution: The technical skill and craftsmanship displayed in the creation of the poster.

MECHANICS FOR QUIZ BEE CONTEST

I. Introduction

The Regional Climate Change Caravan Quiz Bee Contest aims to raise awareness and knowledge about climate change and its impact on the environment. The contest will provide a platform for participants to showcase their understanding of climate change issues and solutions, fostering a sense of environmental responsibility.

II. Eligibility

The contest is open to students from grades 9 to 12, the Division Offices are given the discretion to select one participant for the quiz bee to represent their Division.

III. Registration

The participants should register at the venue before the contest starts to account for each Division Office entry. The Division DRRM Coordinator is the designated official contact person for registration and communication purposes.

IV. Format

 The quiz bee will consist of three rounds: preliminary, semifinal, and final. Each contestant should bring a 1/8 size illustration board, chalk, and an eraser.

Preliminary:

- 2. The preliminary round will be conducted as a written test to evaluate the participants' knowledge of climate change-related topics. The questions will be in multiple-choice or short-answer format.
- 3. The top 8 participants with the highest scores from the preliminary round will advance to the semifinal round.

Semifinal:

- 4. The questions will be a mix of multiple-choice, fill-in-the-blanks, and true/false.
- 5. The top 5 participants with the highest score will advance to the final round.

Final Round:

- 6. The finalists will face a series of challenging questions. The format may include multiple-choice, true/false, short-answer, and visual identification questions.
- 7. The team with the highest score at the end of the final round will be declared the winner.

V. Question Bank

The quiz questions will cover various aspects of climate change, including but not limited to:

- a. Causes of climate change (e.g., greenhouse gas emissions, deforestation)
- b. Impact of climate change on ecosystems (e.g., biodiversity loss, sea-level rise)
- c. Renewable energy sources and sustainable practices
- d. Climate change adaptation and mitigation strategies

e. International agreements and initiatives (e.g., Paris Agreement, Kyoto Protocol) f. Role of individuals, communities, and governments in addressing climate change

VI. Time Management

Each round will have a predetermined time limit to ensure the smooth progress of the contest. Participants must complete answering questions within the given time frame.

VII. Moderation and Scoring

A quizmaster will moderate the contest, ensuring fairness and adherence to the rules. Scores will be awarded based on correct answers, with partial credit given for partially correct responses. In case of a tie, a tiebreaker round will be conducted to determine the winner.

VIII. Awards and Recognition

The winning team will be awarded a prize and certificates. Certificates of participation will be provided to all participants. The contest results and the winning team will be announced and celebrated during a closing ceremony or event.
