

### Workshop on Learner-Centered Approaches for Technical Vocational and Livelihood Education (TVL) in the Basic Education Sector 14-16 August 2023 / UP-NISMED

The Skills for Prosperity Project in the Philippines (SfP-Philippines), funded by the UK Government and implemented by the International Labour Organization (ILO), works with key government agencies, employers' organisations, trade unions and other stakeholders to further boost skills development and technical vocational education systems in the country.

The International Labour Organization (ILO) recognizes the benefits of inclusive education, particularly in technical vocational education and training (TVET). Aside from promoting the wellbeing of individual trainees, an inclusive TVET contributes to the economic competitiveness of a country (ILO, 2020). However, there are several components of TVET where exclusion might happen such as access, curriculum, learning delivery, learning resources, assessment, and transition to work (ILO, 2020). To ensure that TVET remains inclusive, the above-mentioned components should be responsive to the needs of the learners.

#### Background of the Workshop

Inclusive education stems from the premise that all learners have unique characteristics, interests, abilities, and specific needs. It recognizes that all learners must have equal access to educational opportunities and must receive individual accommodation in the teaching and learning process. An inclusive education system accommodates all students whatever their abilities or requirements, and at all levels - pre-school, primary, secondary, tertiary, vocational, and life-long learning (UNICEF, 2017). Critical to inclusive quality education is the use of learnercentred approaches, which puts students' learning at the front and center of the teaching and learning process. For TVET, the European Centre for the Development of Vocational Training (CEDEFOP) has defined learner-centred pedagogy as "a range of learning theories, teaching methods, and teaching cultures that make education more responsive and accessible to learners; aligned with the nature of learning processes; linked with the interests, capacities, and needs of individual learners; and associated with learning outcomes that are defined in the curricula". CEDEFOP further reported that learner-centred approaches in TVET are effective in improving learners' achievement, motivation, engagement, satisfaction, and progression.<sup>2</sup> Through learner-centred approaches, learners can understand the relevance of "school learning" to real work, which is critical in shaping occupational aspirations as well as transitioning to employment.

In preparation for the new school year 2023-2024 and in support of the Deped Basic Education Development Program 2023, and the MATATAG agenda, which prioritizes making the curriculum relevant to produce job-ready, active, and responsible citizens, taking good care of

learners by promoting learner well-being, inclusive education, and a positive learning environment; and **giving** support for teachers to teach better, the ILO Skills for Prosperity Programme and the Center for Integrated STEM Education is organizing a workshop on learner-centered approaches to provide teachers with the teacher tools to placing students at the front and center of the teaching and learning process, for TVL subjects.

The capacity-building workshop will be designed for 3 full days of in-person training. It will introduce to the participants the learner-centred dimensions of TVET, which emphasize the formation of VET identity, the connection between theory and practice, the "learning by doing" approach, authenticity of tasks, coaching, and the development of regulatory and reflective skills. Participants in the workshop will also be immersed in different learner-centred, activities and assessments that are appropriate for TVET qualifications.

#### **Objectives**

- To introduce participants to learner-centered dimensions of TVET learning
- To provide teachers and school administrators a toolbox of learner-centered approaches in TVL learning
- To help teachers design learner centered techniques in TVL subjects using learning exemplars in selected TVL subjects

#### **Workshop Expectations**

At the end of the workshop, participants are expected to:

- analyze dimensions of learner-centred approaches that are relevant to their respective TVET qualifications;
- demonstrate best TVET practices that demonstrate "learning by doing" approach, theory-practice connections, task authenticity, and development of self-regulation and reflective skills suited for TVL learners
- try out learner-centred activities and assessments; and
- redesign existing lesson plans and create learner-centred worksheets

#### **Expected Participants**

The workshop is recommended for TVL teachers, Science and TVL Education Program Supervisors (EPS), Chief Education Supervisor or Head of Curriculum and Instruction Division, and School Heads of schools/divisions offering Cookery, Computer Systems Servicing, Agri-Crop Production, and Electrical Installation and Maintenance.
