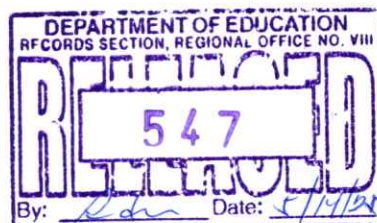

CONDUCT OF THE 2025 PALARONG PAMBANSA

To: Undersecretaries

1. Pursuant to Sections 6, 8, 9, and 10 of Rule II of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of the Republic Act (RA) No. 10588 otherwise known as the *Palarong Pambansa* Act of 2013, the Department of Education (DepEd), in coordination with the Philippine Sports Commission and the Department of the Interior and Local Government, shall conduct the **2025 Palarong Pambansa** to be held in Ilocos Norte Province from May 24 to June 2, 2025.
2. With this year's theme, *Nagkakaisang Kapuluan*, the annual national scholastic multi-sport competition shall be hosted by the Provincial Government of Ilocos Norte together with the DepEd Region I (Ilocos Region) Office and the Schools Division Office of Ilocos Norte.
3. In relation to the conduct of the 65th edition of the *Palarong Pambansa*, essential information relative to the event is contained in the following enclosed documents for easy reference of all concerned:



| 2025 PALARONG PAMBANSA GENERAL INFORMATION

The **65th edition of the Palarong Pambansa**, with the theme "*Nagkakaisang Kapuluan*", is scheduled from May 24 to May 31, 2025, and shall be hosted by the local government unit (LGU) of Ilocos Norte Province together with the DepEd–Region I (Ilocos Region) Office and the Schools Division Office (SDO) of Ilocos Norte.

All regional delegations are advised to arrive in Ilocos Norte **not earlier than May 20, 2025**. Further, the regional delegations are enjoined to attend the **Closing Program** on **May 31, 2025**.

Sports to Compete

- The official regular sports in the elementary and secondary level, as provided in Section 27 of Rule VI of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) 10588 otherwise known as the *Palarong Pambansa Act of 2013*, shall remain to be played in this edition of the *Palarong Pambansa*, as follows:

2. **Pencak Silat** and **Pole Vault–Secondary Girls** (Athletics) will be featured as regular sports; **Weightlifting** as demonstration sport; and **Kickboxing, Football (Secondary Girls)**, and **Futsal (Elementary Girls)** as exhibition sports in this year's *Palarong Pambansa*.
3. There shall be separate events for learner-athletes with special needs such as **Para-Athletics, Para-Swimming, Bocce**, and **Goalball**. Medals shall be awarded to the winners of the said special games.
4. The **Palaro ng Lahi/Larong Pinoy** will also be featured in the 2025 *Palarong Pambansa* to promote the Philippine Games, as well as preserve and appreciate the cultural heritage of Filipino indigenous people among our learners.
5. All regions are requested to actively participate in the *Palaro ng Lahi/Larong Pinoy* and Exhibition Sports by sending representatives from their respective delegations.

Screening & Accreditation

6. The National Screening and Accreditation Committee (NSAC) for this year's *Palarong Pambansa* is hereby constituted by the *Palarong Pambansa* Board to conduct the screening and accreditation of athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones submitted by the participating regional delegations, pursuant to OUOPS Memorandum entitled *Guidelines on the Eligibility of Athletes in the Division, Regional, and National Level for the 2025 Palarong Pambansa*. All other issuances inconsistent with the aforementioned guidelines are hereby rescinded.

General Competition Guidelines

7. As a reiteration, this year's *Palarong Pambansa* shall adopt the **Modified Winner-Take-All policy** for all team sports (Basketball, Baseball, Softball, Football, Futsal, Sepak Takraw and Volleyball) and the **Qualifying Standards** for measurable sports such as Athletics, Swimming, and Archery.
8. In cases of **heavy rains, extreme heat**, or other natural occurrences that may affect the competition, the tournament directors, with the concurrence of the host-LGU, may recommend the suspension of the conduct of the games for a certain period, with the approval of the *Palarong Pambansa* Secretary General on adjustments in games schedule or change in playing venues, provided that the competitions must be finished within the given schedule.
9. Consistent with DepEd's existing policies and guidelines in resolving **protest on game technicalities** of any sports event and **protest on eligibility**, complaints should be in written form, with affidavits of witnesses and/or evidence to support the same. There shall be **no protest fee** to be collected from the protesting regional delegation.

Awards & Recognition

10. The **Olympic Medal System** shall be applied. The total number of gold, silver, and bronze medals to be contested in the different sports events is provided in Enclosure No. 6.
11. Medals awarded in the demonstration sports shall not be included in the medal count earned by the regional delegation.
12. The top 5 regional delegations shall be recognized based on the overall standings in the official medal tally. However, recognition will be bestowed, as well, to the top performing regional delegations in each sport played in the 2025 *Palarong Pambansa*.
13. The top 5 SDOs/LGUs shall also be recognized based on their total medal haul in the 2025 *Palarong Pambansa*.
14. The following may be given cash incentives, pursuant to Section 15 (b) of DepEd Order (DO) No. 43, s. 2016 entitled *Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act 10588 or the Palarong Pambansa Act of 2013*, subject to the availability of funds and in accordance with the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations:
 - a. 2025 *Palarong Pambansa* medalists and new record holders in regular sports events including the top three winners in the special games; and
 - b. Technical officials and other personnel who served in the conduct of the 2025 *Palarong Pambansa*.
15. **Cash incentives** may be supplemented from the proceeds of the solicitation from various sponsors and donors engaged in by the *Palarong Pambansa* Sponsorship Committee in line with its functions stipulated specifically in Section 16 (c) of DO 43, s. 2016.

National Technical Working Committees & Technical Officials

16. The 2025 *Palarong Pambansa* Organizational Structure containing the list of members of the *Palarong Pambansa* Board, National Executive Committee and Steering Committee, and the various national technical working committees is hereby provided under Enclosure No. 1. The list of the members of the various national technical working committees and technical officials of the different sports events shall be issued through a separate Memorandum.
17. All DepEd personnel who will serve in the 2025 *Palarong Pambansa* as accredited technical officials or members of the different national and local working committees shall be granted vacation leave credits pursuant to the provisions of DepEd Order No. 13, s. 2024 entitled *Revised Guidelines on Grant of Vacation Service Credits to Teachers*.
18. All technical officials must satisfy all the requirements provided in the enclosed Guidelines for the Selection of Technical Officials in the *Palarong Pambansa* (Enclosure No. 4).
19. The following documentary requirements shall be presented by the selected technical officials upon registration:
 - a. Authority to Travel documents:

- i. **For DepEd employees** – approved travel authority duly signed by their respective heads of office;
 - ii. **For National Sports Association (NSA) members** – official letter from the Association President or Secretary General (or any duly authorized NSA official) authorizing their participation;
 - iii. **For those coming from Host Local Government Unit (LGU)** – letter of endorsement from the Local Chief Executive, City/Provincial Administrator, or authorized official in charge of 2025 *Palarong Pambansa*; and
 - iv. **For Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) employees** – official Travel Order from the PSC Executive Director.
- b. Two (2) recent 2" x 2" ID pictures;
 - c. **Medical certificate** issued by a government physician certifying that he/she is physically fit and able to serve during the *Palarong Pambansa*; and
 - d. **Full Disclosure Form** (Annex A to Enclosure No. 4).
20. Failure to submit all abovementioned documents shall be a ground for denial of registration.
21. All members of various technical working committees may be given additional subsidies – on top of the allowable expenses to be given – as may be authorized, charged against the Physical Fitness and School Sports (PFSS) Funds, subject to the existing government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
22. Transportation expenses of all members of the various national technical working committees and technical officials from their respective stations/offices to Ilocos Norte Province and back shall be charged against the Physical Fitness and School Sports (PFSS) Funds, subject to the usual government accounting and auditing rules and regulations. They shall also be provided with a meal allowance during their actual official stay. All members of various technical working committees and technical officials **must use the most economical and austere means of transportation.**

Guidelines on the Safety and Welfare of Regional Delegations

23. All regions shall provide personal accident insurance coverage to all the members of its delegation, which will cover the period from departure to arrival at the respective stations.
24. All regions shall adhere to the provisions of DepEd Order (DO) No. 40, s. 2012 (DepEd Child Protection Policy). Therefore, all regional delegation officials shall be accountable for the protection, welfare, and safety of their learner-athletes. In addition, each of the DepEd regional offices shall provide medical insurance coverage for its respective members of the delegation.
25. In compliance with DO 13, s. 2017 entitled *Policy and Guidelines on Healthy Food and Beverage Choices in Schools and in DepEd Offices*, all regional delegations shall promote healthy eating habits by making available healthy and nutritious food and beverages during the 2025 *Palarong Pambansa*.

26. The **No Alcohol, No Smoking, and No Gambling Policy** of this Department shall be strictly observed for the duration of the 2025 *Palarong Pambansa*. Violators shall be dealt with accordingly.
27. The **Clean As You Go (CLAYGo)** principle must be strictly followed by all participants in the 2025 *Palarong Pambansa* to ensure a clean, hygienic, safe, and organized environment (billeting schools, playing venues, workplace, etc.). The use of reusable materials such as tumblers, eating utensils, among others is also highly encouraged.
28. The regional directors/heads of the regional delegations are enjoined to lodge and stay with their respective delegates in the assigned billeting school/s.

Consent, Waiver, Indemnity, and Release on the Use of Images and Video Recordings

29. By participating in *Palarong Pambansa*, all athletes, coaches, officials, and attendees acknowledge and grant DepEd the right to use, display, exhibit, reproduce, distribute, and create derivative works from these materials in any media now known or developed in the future.
30. To formalize this acknowledgment, all participants are required to sign the waiver enclosed in this Memorandum (Enclosure No. 8), granting DepEd the necessary permissions for the use of images and recordings taken during the event.

GUIDELINES FOR THE SELECTION OF TECHNICAL OFFICIALS FOR THE *PALARONG PAMBANSA*

I. RATIONALE

The Department of Education (DepEd), through the *Palarong Pambansa* Secretariat, conducted the clustered National Accreditation of Technical Officials aimed at assessing and determining the level of expertise, skills, and knowledge in areas such as rules of the game, game management, actual officiating and physical fitness through the administration of written, practical, and fitness tests.

The Accreditation was categorized into three (3) classification levels based on the results of the participating technical officials' practicum, written, and physical fitness tests, and the corresponding level of officiating, as follows:

Classification	Level of Officiating
a. Class A	National Level & below
b. Class B	Regional Level & below
c. Class C	Division Level & below

The result of the National Accreditation shall serve as the basis for the selection of technical officials who will serve in this year's *Palarong Pambansa* scheduled from May 24 to June 2, 2025 in Ilocos Norte. The validity of the results of the National Accreditation of Technical Officials is within three (3) years from its issuance.

The tournament directors (TDs) and assistant tournament directors (ATDs) who have gone through the process of Accreditation shall continue to perform their duties as such, regardless of their classification, as they have undergone a more meticulous process for the selection of TDs and ATDs for the *Palarong Pambansa*.

II. SELECTION OF TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

Regions that will be recommending their respective **technical officials** to serve in the *Palarong Pambansa* shall observe the following guidelines:

- The individual must come from the pool of **Class A** technical officials based on the National Accreditation results;
- In the absence of Class A technical officials in some sports, the recommended individual to serve in the *Palarong Pambansa* must come from the pool of **Class B** technical officials, specifically the **highest performing Class B (B+)**;
- In cases where the highest classification for a sport is **B**, the region may recommend such technical official provided that it has been vetted and approved by the tournament director to qualify to officiate;



- d. If there are no available Class A, B+, or B, the technical official slot of the region for that particular sport will be waived;
- e. **Class C** technical officials are not allowed to officiate in the *Palarong Pambansa*;
- f. Waived regional slots for technical officials will be given to the host region or nearby regions, whichever has the slot for Class A, B+, or B, provided that it has been vetted and approved by the tournament director to qualify to officiate;
- g. The recommended technical official must be **55 years old and below** in the year of the *Palarong Pambansa*, and must be **physically fit** to officiate; and
- h. Must secure **medical clearance** to officiate in the *Palarong Pambansa* from a licensed doctor of any government medical facility.

Provided that, all selected tournament officials shall, upon registration, submit and execute a **Full Disclosure** of all information regarding conflict of interest, relevant data and any other material facts that may impact the officiating relationship and decision-making process of the selected technical official with any of the competing learner-athlete in the *Palarong Pambansa*.

The technical official guarantees that the information they provide is accurate to the best of their knowledge and failure to do so may be a valid ground for disqualification as a technical official in the *Palarong Pambansa*. A sample disclosure form is attached herewith as Annex A.

III. SELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE CORE GROUP

Tournament Directors who will be recommending the respective members of their **core group** to serve in the *Palarong Pambansa* as technical consultants or personnel shall observe the following guidelines:

- a. The core group shall consist of the **TDs, ATDs, tournament secretaries (TSs)**, and the **technical personnel/experts** of the respective sports;
- b. Must be **highly competent** and **possesses specialized skill** in the respective sport;
- c. Preferably a **technical person from a national sports association (NSA)** duly recognized by the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) and Philippine Olympic Committee (POC); and
- d. May not have undergone the National Accreditation and no age limit required provided that the recommended personnel is **physically fit** to serve in the *Palarong Pambansa*, evidenced by a **medical clearance** issued by a licensed doctor.
- e. In case a DepEd personnel is recommended as a member of the core group, it must be vetted and approved by his/her respective regional office.

These guidelines shall serve as a supplemental reference to the Memorandum issued by the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Operations (OASOPS) and *Palarong Pambansa* Secretary General on the **Result of the 2023 National Accreditation of Technical Officials** and must be strictly observed by the regional sports officers (RSOs), TDs, and ATDs.

Sports not included in this enclosure shall strictly adopt the technical guidelines implemented during the 2024 *Palarong Pambansa*, while all other provisions not affected by the changes/modifications in the technical guidelines of the sports enlisted below shall remain in effect.

Team Sports

Pursuant to the *Palarong Pambansa* Ad Referendum Board Resolution No. 2025-001 entitled *Adoption of the Modified Winner-Take-All Policy for Team Sports in the 2025 Palarong Pambansa* and DepEd Office of the Undersecretary for Operations Memorandum No. OM-OUOPS-2025-05-00833 entitled *Conduct of the 2025 Palarong Pambansa*, teams shall consist of core players (enrolled in the same school) plus **additional three (3) players** from other schools/divisions to strengthen the team and ensure the representation of the best players from the region.

Wrestling

Rules of the Game

1. Bringing back the 1 pin down rules:

- 1 pin down to win the match regarding it happen 1st or 2nd round.
- The wrestler who pin-downs his opponent will win the match by fall.
- If the referee declared fall/pin down without the approval of the mat chairman, the pin down/fall is invalid. No pin down if the head is outside the circle.
- The Challenge is accepted if the pin down is questionable. After reviewing the video, the TD/TM will announce the challenge decision.

2. Modification for the Weigh-In:

- The weigh-in is organized each morning for the concerned weight category for all competitions. The weigh-in and the medical control lasts 30 minutes per weight category.
- The weight category can be organized in one day for the competitions in the lower meet where less than 16 athletes are registered. If so, the medical control and the weigh-in remain on the morning of the competition and the draw could be organized during the weigh-in. Each weight category is organized in two days.
- We apply plus two (2) kilos per category during the weigh-in. No underweight allowed.

3. Point System:

- For Free-Style, for the safety of wrestlers, only one (1), two (2) and four (4) points shall apply in our current Setup. (All high amplitude throws are forbidden, if the wrestler uses any high amplitude Throws (Suplex and lifting up), it will result in immediate disqualification).
- Any attempt of high amplitude throw must be stopped or be given a caution (if the throw continued) upon the agreement of three (3) refereeing bodies (mat chairman, judge, and referee).
- One (1) arm throw and a fireman's throw are only allowed in low amplitude (kneeling). Any high arm and fireman's throw will result in a disqualification.

4. Greco-Roman:

Greco-Roman wrestling style is played as exhibition games in 2025 Palarong Pambansa.






