- 1. In line with strengthening the implementation of the SNED Program in basic education and fulfilling the provisions of Republic Act 11650, otherwise known as "Instituting a Policy of Inclusion and Services for Learners with Disabilities in Support of Inclusive Education Act", the Department of Education (DepEd), through the Bureau of Learning Delivery - Student Inclusion Division (BLD-SID), will conduct the series of workshops at DepEd ECOTECH, Lahug, Cebu City as follows:
  - 1.1 Workshop on the **Development** of Collaborative Expertise Learning Resource Packages on Special Needs Education (SNED) Content and Pedagogy on June 25-27, 2025;
  - 1.2 Workshop on the Validation of Collaborative Expertise Learning Resource Packages on Special Needs Education (SNED) Content and Pedagogy on July 2-4, 2025;
  - 1.3 Workshop on the **Finalization** of Collaborative Expertise Learning Resource Packages on Special Needs Education (SNED) Content and Pedagogy on August 13-15, 2025.
- 2. These workshops aim to produce a comprehensive set of Collaborative Expertise Learning Resource Packages on SNED Content and Pedagogy,













in enhancing the professional development of general education teachers in public elementary and secondary schools -serving as SNED Receiving Teachers—to effectively support Inclusive Education and implement SNED programs for Learners with Disabilities (LWDs). Specifically, it will:

- 2.1 develop collaborative expertise learning resource packages in the form of modules and session guides that will cover a range of crucial SNED topics which will be tailored for general education teachers designated as SNED Receiving Teachers;
- 2.2 validate and review necessary components of the resource packages to ensure that these materials will be effectively utilized as tools for knowledge-sharing of best practices on SNED content and pedagogy among various education stakeholders; and
- 2.3 finalize and provide learning resource packages for SNED Receiving Teachers to ensure the effective and efficient conduct of collaborative expertise sessions that promote and implement Inclusive Education Programs, specifically the SNED Programs for Learners with Disabilities in basic education.
- 3. This Office requests the participation of the identified DepEd personnel listed in Annex A, reminding them as well to:
  - 3.1bring laptops and extension cords if deemed necessary; be guided of the terms of reference provided in **Annex B**;
  - 3.2be in the venue on the indicated schedule provided in Annex C; and
  - 3.3 register no later than June 24, 2025 through the link: https://tinyurl.com/CollabExpertiseSNED.
- 4. Board and lodging, travel expenses, and other incidental expenses of participants shall be charged against the FY 2025 SNED Program Funds downloaded to the regions subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 5. Compensatory Time-Off (CTO) shall be granted to the participants in lieu if the workshop day/s falling on either national/local holidays or weekends in accordance with CSC and DBM Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2004.



## ANNEX B: TERMS OF REFERENCE

Workshops on the Development, Validation and Finalization of Collaborative Expertise Learning Resource Packages on Special Needs Education (SNED) Content and Pedagogy.

## 1. Technical Working Group (TWG)

- 1.1 The TWG is composed of selected Education Program Specialists from the DepEd Central Office and Resource Persons from Teacher Education Institutions (TEIs). They are identified for their technical expertise and experience in materials development, inclusive education, and policy implementation.
- 1.2 The TWG will provide strategic guidance and oversee the entire process of developing, validating, and finalizing the SNED learning resource packages.
- 1.3 Their role ensures that the materials align with national standards and inclusive education frameworks. They will also coordinate the activities of writers and validators to maintain consistency and quality.
- 1.4Their leadership is essential in endorsing the final outputs for official use.

### 2. Writers

- 2.1 Writers are composed of SNED teachers, school principals, education program supervisors, and other field-based implementers of the SNED program. They were selected for their firsthand experience, SNED specialization and deep understanding of inclusive education practices in basic education settings.
- 2.2 Their role is to translate policy and pedagogical concepts into practical, teacher-friendly modules and session guides. They are expected to integrate classroom-based strategies and field-tested approaches into the resource packages. Their participation ensures the content is contextually relevant, inclusive, and grounded in real teaching experiences.
- 2.3 Writers will work closely with the TWG and incorporate feedback from validators to improve their outputs.

#### 3. Validators

- 3.1 Validators are composed of selected general education teachers, SNED teachers, supervisors, and experienced SNED implementers. They were identified based on their classroom experience and involvement in inclusive education initiatives.
- 3.2 Their role is to review and assess the draft materials to ensure accuracy, inclusivity, and usability. They will use validation tools to provide structured, evidence-based feedback for improvement. Their insights are critical in determining whether the resource packages are practical and aligned with the needs of teachers and learners.
- 3.3 Validators will endorse the refined materials for finalization and field implementation. While some of the validators have formal training, exposure to SNED implementation, or specialized SNED backgrounds, others may not have direct specialization or capacity-building in SNED. This diversity is intentional and strategic. It ensures that the resource packages are not only technically sound of SPED contexts but also accessible and understandable to general education stakeholders who play













a crucial role in Inclusive Education particularly for the Learners with Disabilities.
