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
**INVITATION TO ATTEND THE NATIONAL SUMMER LEADERSHIP



Furthermore, these are the **enabling objectives**:



The Saceda Youth Lead will hold the 28th Edition of the National Summer Leadership Camp (NSLC) at the SYL Center, Parok Atis, Palimpinon, Valencia, Negros Oriental, on April 20–26, 2026.

The 2026 SYL NSLC aims to graduate young men and women who will possess essential leadership skills combined with values, enabling them to effectively carry out leadership roles and responsibilities. Specifically, it aims to:

1. Study the global and regional challenges—their common patterns that emerge across all cultures—and understand how these patterns reveal the diversity of human experience to mitigate or control its effects;
2. Identify similarities in these effects and examine how schools, governments, and leaders can develop viable solutions;
3. Provide opportunities to meet and collaborate with fellow leaders;
4. Enrich education through a series of presentations and discussions on the global and regional challenges;
5. Formulate or develop sustainable solutions;
6. Empower and inspire participants to become future leaders; and
7. Promote peace and mutual understanding.

The 2026 SYL NSLC welcomes student leaders from public and private schools, college students, teachers, Sangguniang Kabataan officials, and elected youth leaders nationwide. Designed for individuals aged 11–22, this camp provides a transformative experience that strengthens leadership skills, values, and collaboration in addressing global and local challenges.

Participation of public and private schools shall be purely voluntary and will not hamper instructional time in compliance with the provisions of DepEd Order (DO) No. 012, s. 2025, titled Multi-Year Implementing Guidelines on the School Calendar and Activities and DO 9, s. 2005, titled Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith and the policy on off-campus activities stated in DO 66, s. 2017.

This is also subject to the no-collection policy as stated in Section 3 of Republic Act No. 5546 also known as An Act Prohibiting the Sale of Tickets and/or the Collection of Contributions for Whatever Project or Purpose from Students and Teachers of Public and Private Schools, Colleges and Universities (Ganzon Law), issued in DO 19, s. 2008, and reiterated in DepEd Memorandum No. 041, s. 2024.

I will cooperate with other members and the staff without complaints and murmur, and I will do my best to maintain a positive attitude. I agree to abide with the above and I am enthusiastic in participating in the program.

Transportation to Dumaguete will be on personal account.

4. Authorize SYL or any of its agents to provide, obtain, or authorize any reasonable incidental and emergency medical treatment for the participants in the event of illness, injury or incapacity and hereby accepts all responsibilities.
