

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

Please take note of the details below:

Event : REGIONAL JUNIOR, SENIOR & CADET CAMP

Date & Venue : March 22-26, 2026
MYVRPTC, Barangay Kalunasan, Cebu City

Theme : *EmpowHER to Act: Cultivating LeadHERship for Lasting Change*

Participants : Junior – minimum of four (4) patrols (of 8 girls) with two Adult Leaders per patrol
Senior – minimum of four (4) patrols (of 8 girls) with one Adult Leader per Council

Camp Fee : P3,500.00 per camper (to cover accommodation, program materials, souvenirs with t-shirt and tours)

Note: Councils will shoulder the food expenses of their delegates.

Pre-Campference : March 21, 2026, 9:00 A.M. (start of meeting of all Central Staff)

All Troop Leaders/Trainers who will serve as Central Staff are required to attend the Central Staff Pre-Campference/Meeting.

Arrival and Settling Down : March 22, 2026 A.M.

Opening Program : March 22, 2026 @ 4:00 P.M.

Closing Ceremony : March 25, 2026 @ 7:00 P.M.

Departure : March 26, 2026, A.M.

Qualifications of Participants:

- Girls** - must be registered Junior, Senior & Cadet Girl Scouts as of September 30, 2025
- must be physically fit and alert as certified by a licensed physician
- must have earned at least one badge under the challenge of Environment, Preparedness, Arts, Heritage & Citizenship
- Adult** - must be registered Troop Leader as of September 30, 2025
- must have undertaken the Outdoor Leadership Course or must be a Campcraft Certificate Holder
- must be physically fit to undergo the rigor of outdoor life
- must know and understand her girls
- must know simple First Aid

A Physical re-check shall be conducted upon arrival at camp. Please ensure that the Girls bring their individual Health Form and Parent's Consent Form for physical re-check.

The activities shall include:

- Junior - Emergency Preparedness, Adventure Games, Arts and Crafts, Protecting the Vulnerable: Awareness on Human Trafficking, Swimming, Campfire, Scout's Own and Tour.
- Senior - Actual First Aid Session, Free Being Me, Mural Painting, Rappelling, Martial Arts, Council Extravaganza, Campfire, Scout's Own and Tour.


