

SUBJECT : **2026 NATIONAL SCOUT YOUTH FORUM**



1. The Boy Scouts of the Philippines is pleased to announce the conduct of the **2026 NATIONAL SCOUT YOUTH FORUM**, which will convene all duly elected Regional Scout Representatives from Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao in one forum venue at the **San Antonio Resort Roxas City, Province of Capiz** from **14-17 April 2026**, hosted by **Capiz Council, Western Visayas Regional Coordinating Office, BSP**.
2. **Background and Rationale.** The Scout Youth Forum is a primordial part of the Youth Development Program of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines and is organized to fill in the need and the clamor for more Youth Participation in the decision-making processes in the Scout Movement. It is a place for information, training and concrete experience of discussing, raising the level of awareness and acquiring a deeper understanding of various issues - by providing contact with new people, fresh ideas, innovative thoughts, different experiences, and working methods.
3. **Aim and Objectives.** The National Scout Youth Forum aims to provide a dual opportunity for young members to discuss and express their views on issues of interest to them, preparing inputs, and reporting to the Boy Scouts of the Philippines, including recommendations to the National Executive Board; and develop the skills necessary to strengthen their capacity to take part in the decision-making process and to actively be involved in their own communities, institutions, and Local Councils.

The Scout Youth Forum shall enable young people to share their ideas and experiences on current issues affecting young people in different parts of the country; suggest ways of strengthening national youth policies and training young people for citizenship; and contribute new ideas to the Movement on how to enrich educational programs for young people.

At the end of the Forum, the Scouts should be able to:

- a. Help young people acquire experiences, opportunities, and skills necessary to express their views, opinions, and ideas constructively, particularly in matters affecting them especially in the implementation of the Scouting Program.

- b. Provide feedback to the governing bodies and the standing committees of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines at all levels especially on Youth Development.
 - c. Enable youth leaders to effectively communicate their needs, wants, interests, aspirations on present national issues, and discover ways to get involved in community service and nation-building.
 - d. Build the capacity of Scout Representatives in terms of capability as leaders and advocates, especially their intrapersonal, interpersonal, and organizational skills, for them to become effective as Scout Representatives.
 - e. Establish an active Scout Representatives Network and strengthen the communication and coordination of Scout Representatives and Youth Leaders between Scouting Regions and Local Councils.
 - f. Provide young people with better understanding of the differences among young people while managing conflicts peaceably in a democratic atmosphere thereby establishing camaraderie and brotherhood
4. **Expected Outputs.** Consistent with the stipulated aims and objectives of the National Scout Youth Forum, the delegates, at the end of the Forum are expected to have been able to:
- a. Discuss, express, and share their views on issues of interest that directly affect them, particularly, on the programs and thrusts of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines.
 - b. Provide relevant recommendations for the revision, improvement, development, introduction of programs and/or policies through NSYF Resolutions for the Boy Scouts of the Philippines, through the National Executive Board.
 - c. Develop the skills necessary to strengthen their capacity to take part in the decision-making processes in the various policy-making and governing bodies of the movement.
 - d. Prepare the required reports for transmittal to the National Office and review of the Program, and Adult Resources Development Unit of the outputs and resolutions adopted during the Forum.
 - e. Elect the National Scout Representatives for Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao for term 2026 – 2027 to the National Executive Board of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines.
5. **Participation by Scouting Region.** The 2026 National Scout Youth Forum will gather 66 Voting Delegates from the 11 Regional Coordinating Offices. Each Regional Coordinating Office is allocated six (6) Voting Delegates to ensure balanced representation and active participation in discussions, decision-making processes, and the formulation of resolutions.
6. **Transmittal of Results of the Regional Scout Youth Forum.** All Regional Youth Development Officers are directed to coordinate to the Field Operations Division, National Office and officially transmit the results of their respective Regional Scout Youth Forum **immediately after its conduct**, in particular the **Regional Post Forum Report**, stating among others, the complete names, birthdates, and current Scouting Rank of the duly elected Regional Scout Representatives, the remaining official voting delegates, certified by the Officers of the Forum Organizing Committee

and the Forum Adviser. This will help facilitate the procurement of tickets to and from the NSYF Venue and other arrangements with the Host Organizing Committee.

7. **Official Voting Delegates.** All Official Voting Delegates as duly certified and endorsed by the Regional Coordinating Offices will be **FREE OF CHARGE**, including Air/Land/Sea Fares, Inland Transportation, Accommodations, Souvenirs, and Meals. **Voting Rights are STRICTLY NOT TRANSFERABLE.**
8. **Accompanying Adults and Forum Observers.** Each Scouting Region is entitled to send a maximum of **two (2) Senior Scouts** as **Forum Observers**, and required to send **at least one (1)** but **not more than three (3) Accompanying Adults**. Each will be charged a Forum Registration Fee of **Php 6,000.00** to cover the Meals, Accommodation, and Souvenirs. Air/Land/Sea Fare to and from the forum venue shall be shouldered by the Accompanying Adults and Forum Observers and/or by their respective Local Councils/Regions. They shall accomplish the attached Reply Slip and submit the same to the National Office.
9. **Forum Observers and Accompanying Adults** are further advised that the **payment** of the corresponding **Forum Registration Fee** shall be deposited to the designated account;

10. **Deadline of Submission of Reply Slips.** All concerned are hereby directed that **immediately after the conduct of RSYF**, the **complete list of the duly elected Official Voting Delegates shall be submitted to the National Office** using the prescribed form, and that the deadline for the submission of reply slips, covering the Official Voting Delegates, Forum Observers, and Accompanying Adults, shall be **on or before 31 March 2026**. Regions that have already finalized their Forum Observers and Accompanying Adults are likewise required to **resubmit the accomplished reply slips**.
11. **Pre-Forum Session.** Prior to the forum proper, a Pre-Forum Session will be conducted on **11 April 2026** from **8:00 AM to 4:00 PM**, this is to ensure that every participant is well-oriented and prepared for the actual forum. Every participant is **required** to be present during the Pre-Forum Session.
12. **Reporting Time.** All participants and accompanying adults are expected to be at the Forum Venue at least **1:00 PM of 14 April 2026 (Tuesday)** and are to stay until the Closing Ceremony by lunch time of **17 April 2026 (Friday)**. Meals will be served from lunch on **14 April 2026** until lunch of **17 April 2026**.

13. **Things to Bring.** Participants are advised to bring the following:

- a. Complete and Proper Type A Uniform (every participant MUST wear the Official Red Neckerchief)
- b. Smart Casual Attire for Socials Night
- c. Cultural Attire and snacks from your respective Regions
- d. Laptops or Tablet PC
- e. Forum Reference Materials
- f. Personal Medications (if any)

14. **Forum Rules and Regulations.** The National Scout Youth Forum 2026 shall be conducted consistent with applicable and appropriate mechanics and procedures pursuant to the rules and regulations set forth in the **National Office Memorandum No. 37, series of 2023** with the subject "**Updated and Revised Scout Youth Forum Guidelines 2023**".
